Your LGBT Center has continued to grow in 2017 offering a number of new programs. The expanded programing now offers training classes, a support group for Alcoholics Anonymous, a support group for Transgender and Non-Conforming individuals, an LGBT book club, and a weekly yoga group to help improve our health. Soon the Leon Bey Memorial Library will be open with regular hours as well as our public computer and game room.

Additionally, your center offers a series of programs to our schools, organizations, and businesses in which we offer classes and teach about diversity, LGBT history, LGBT resources, safe spaces, and transgender awareness and acceptance. This past year we have taught such classes at Miami Valley Hospital, Premier Health, Montgomery County Children's Services, Montgomery County Foster Parents, various high schools, Dayton Job Center, and the School of Professional Psychology. We have reached out to thousands of people through various table top events promoting and introducing the center to an all new group of allies.

We continue to offer our quarterly dinner series that we may all get together to share a meal and re-acquaint with each other as a community. Our largest community dinner continues to be our annual Thanksgiving Dinner. The tradition of Thanksgiving began with a community and we certainly continue that tradition for our LGBTQIA family. No one should feel disenfranchised during the holiday season. We continue to welcome all for each of our community dinners.




Holiday Clothing Exchange
